Roads Update

Council has received notification from TfNSW advising that our application under the RLRRP has been successful in securing additional funding. This is in addition to the initial FLR - Pothole Repair fund allocation.

Road Works - Council would like to advise motorists that heavy rehabilitation, concrete work, stormwater drainage and road sealing works are to be carried out on the following Roads:

- Cowabbie St (Stinson St Booth St) Pavement upgrade works are schedule to commence on the 20th February.
- MR243 Canola Way East of Marrar 2.1km road reconstruction has commenced.
- MR398 Mary Gilmore Way Stage 2 Shoulder widening has commenced.
- Wade St (Canola Way) Coolamon Multiple concrete driveway installation has commenced.
- Methul Road 1.2km road reconstruction to commence start of March.
- Chamberlains Lane 3.0km Stage 2 Reconstruction and bitumen sealing to commence start of March.
- MR243 Canola Way East of Coolamon 1.3km road reconstruction to commence end of March.
- Shire Rural Road Bitumen Reseals commencing in March/ April.

Portable traffic lights will be on site and motorists may experience delays up to 5 minutes. Please exercise caution, observe road signage and road conditions.

Road Conditions - Council would like to advise motorists that maintenance grading is in progress on the Unsealed Road Network throughout the Shire. Please exercise caution, observe road signage, road conditions and drive accordingly.

Road Closures - All Shire roads are open at present.

Grant Application for Heritage Works 2022/2023

Applications will open in March for grant funding associated with heritage conservation enhancement works. This funding is directed towards assistance with minor works that will enhance or identify local heritage items. All work is required to be completed in the financial year that the money is allocated. The allocation of these grants will be on a dollar for dollar basis with priority being given, but not limited to heritage items.

Application forms are now available at the Coolamon Shire Council and on our website. Closing date for submissions will be no later than the close of business on **Friday 26th May 2023.** The successful applicants will be notified after the June Council meeting. Heritage Conservation Areas

In the conservation area, development consent is required for minor works where the appearance of the exterior of the property is being altered, such as the erection of a new fence, repainting of the exterior of the home, signage, or the installation of air conditioners and solar panels. Minor works where you are replacing 'like for like' does not require development consent, however, you are advised to contact Council prior to commencing any works. Council offers a free heritage advisory service for people wishing to receive advice on proposed developments within the Conservation Area or buildings listed as being of Heritage Significance.

Bin Etiquette and your Collection

Bin etiquette and placement is an important part of waste management and helps keep everyone happy.

- Place your bin/s out on the kerbside the evening before your collection day.
- Please note: Garbage trucks stop frequently and to avoid unnecessary disruption to the service and danger to both motorists and the garbage collectors, certain roads with high traffic volumes may have their collection start before 6.00am.
- Ensure lids are fully closed, as overfull bin/s may not be collected.
- Do not place rubbish on top of or beside the bin/s.
- Ensure your bin/s weighs less than 80kg +.
- Space your bin 0.5m 1m apart from other bins.

Place your bin/s on clear ground in front of and abutting the kerb and gutter and away from any obstructions, such as vehicles, overhanging trees, electricity poles and letter boxes.

In areas with no kerb and gutter, place your bins in the road reserve abutting the edge of seal and where there is no seal, place your bin at the edge of road formation.

Residents are also reminded that unless additional services (extra bins) have been paid for and rated, that additional bins will not be collected by the collection contractor. If you require an additional service of bin, please contact Council to make appropriate arrangements. The garbage contractor has been instructed not to collect additional unauthorised services/bins.
