SPRING CLEANING - FIRE PREPAREDNESS Coming in to the warmer months it is important to assess and rectify possible dangers/untidiness in your yard and property. Your property upkeep is your responsibility. Include the outside yard or entirety of your block in your spring cleaning schedule. You, as the registered owner or tenant, will need to ensure that all lots are maintained in a clean and tidy condition, not overgrown, free from accumulations of rubbish or waste material. If the grass exceeds forty centimeters (40cm) in length Council may issue a notice to cut the grass. Council may issue penalty infringement notices, should the registered

proprietor not attend to their property, after receiving the abovementioned notices. **Please note: Councils Rangers** will be commencing the Spring Property Assessments soon.

What is recycling contamination and why is it a problem? Recycling contamination occurs when the wrong materials are

placed in the recycling bin. This includes materials that are not currently recyclable, or not recyclable at our facilities, or items that belong in your organics bin.

There has been a noticeable increase in contamination reports from recycling and organics collections. If the current levels we are seeing continue, Council officers will implement an audit of kerb side pick-ups.

sites have been DrumMUSTER accredited and collection of recycled drums take place all year round subject to opening hours.

Eligible Containers: DrumMUSTER collects eligible non-returnable metal or plastic containers where the capacity of the container is at least 1L/Kg but not greater than 205L/Kg of declared content in the packaging of crop production and animal health products used for agriculture. Participating manufacturers are identified by the inclusion of the eligible *Drum*MUSTER container logo on their eligible containers. The logo can be displayed on the chemical label, embossed into the container wall or applied as a sticker to the container. Containers not displaying this logo may be from non-participating manufacturers and will not be accepted into the program.
