### Cats

On the 1 July 2020 the Government introduced annual permits for owners of non-desexed cats. This means that owners of cats not desexed by four months of age are required to pay an annual permit in addition to their one-off lifetime pet registration fee.

If your cat is desexed, you are only required to pay a one off registration fee. Pet owners will be able to pay for annual permits through their local Council. Cats, as with dogs, are required to be kept within the confines of the owners property.

## Scar tree relocation project

A collaborated effort between Riverina Local Land Services (LLS) and Coolamon Shire Council (CSC) has resulted in the relocation of a large scar tree from Councils road reserve to the Coolamon township urban walking and riding trail.

The tree required removal from CSC road reserve following arborist assessment and determination as a hazard to the public.

In felling of the tree it was possible to retain the scar and with a generous contribution of \$3000 from LLS, Council were able to relocate it the new location of Lewis Street – Kindra Forest side between Rannock Rd and Kindra Forest gateway.

# **Pool Safety Requirements**

# Make sure your pool is fenced and meets safety regulations, even if it is an inflatable pool.

With summer and the swimming season fast approaching Council recognises the importance of working with the community to promote increased safety for young children around backyard pools.

By law, all pools that can be filled with 30cm of water or more must have a fence that meets the requirements of the Swimming Pool Act and Regulations, additional safety requirements include (but not limited to) updated resuscitation sign, eliminating climbable zones and pool compliant gates. Penalties for not complying have been increased by the NSW Government to \$5,500.

Remember, a pool fence does not mean children are automatically protected, there is no substitute for supervision and vigilance. Make sure you regularly check your swimming pool and fence for faults throughout the year and never take your eyes off children when they are in or near water.
