



THIS TERM HAS PRESENTED MANY OPPORTUNITIES FOR COUNCIL TO LEVERAGE SIGNIFICANT FUNDING FROM BOTH THE STATE AND FEDERAL GOVERNMENTS DESIGNED TO STIMULATE LOCAL ECONOMIES. COUNCIL TOOK A STRATEGIC AND CONSULTATIVE APPROACH TO THESE OPPORTUNITIES, WORKING WITH VARIOUS GROUPS AND CLUBS TOGETHER WITH THE COMMUNITY AS A WHOLE TO ENSURE THAT FUNDED PROJECTS MET THE NEEDS OF OUR GROWING TOWNS AND VILLAGES. WHERE APPROPRIATE, COUNCIL OPTED TO INVEST IN EXISTING INFRASTRUCTURE AND ASSETS TO ENSURE THEIR LONG TERM SUSTAINABILITY. ALONGSIDE THE SIGNIFICANT IMPROVEMENTS TO COUNCIL ASSETS, COUNCIL WERE ABLE TO ALLOCATE FUNDING TO EXTERNAL GROUPS AND CLUBS TO SUPPORT THEIR IMPROVEMENTS. THIS TERM HAS SEEN THE INTRODUCTION OF THE REGIONAL GROWTH FUND AND SUBSEQUENT STRONGER COUNTRY COMMUNITIES GRANTS, A TOTAL INVESTMENT OF \$3 MILLION FROM THE STATE GOVERNMENT OVER THE PAST FOUR YEARS AND THE DROUGHT STIMULUS PACKAGE OF \$1.97M. IN THE SAME PERIOD, THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT RELEASED THE DROUGHT **COMMUNITIES PROGRAM TOTALLING \$2M** INVESTMENT INTO OUR COMMUNITY IN RESPONSE TO THE EFFECTS OF DROUGHT IN

As an organisation, Council understands the importance of upholding all the values that make our community what it is. We believe that as with any change, the heart and soul of our community is what makes us unique, and as such, we strive to maintain our inherent values as our communities continue to grow and thrive.

Council supports various local service organisations and community groups like Coolamon Lions, Rotary, the Community Chronicle and various sporting groups and clubs. This has enabled the fostering of community partnerships and networks and encouraged volunteerism across all aspects of the Coolamon Shire community.

This term has also seen an overhaul of the "Visit Coolamon Shire" brand, a new website and further collaborative networking with neighbouring councils to promote the Coolamon Shire as a great place to live, work and visit.

Coolamon Shire is bucking the trend in relation to population decline in rural areas. Council's population from the 2016 ABS Census was recorded as 4,315.



The most commonly cited aspect that is liked about living in the Coolamon Shire is that there is a friendly sense of community (39%) followed by rural atmosphere and country lifestyle (29%) A further 28% felt the area was quiet and peaceful


SO COUNCIL...

Coolamon Shire Council believe that all members of our community deserve and should have access to the services and infrastructure to make their lives in the shire as happy and healthy as possible Council has taken a very active role in the provision of services and facilities that support families, youth and seniors within the Shire. This term has seen significant improvements to both the Coolamon Early Childhood Centre and to Allawah Lodge. The coming together of Federal, State and Local government funding has seen building extensions to both facilities to allow for greater capacity and usability.

Council also facilitates the provision of premises for the Ganmain and Coolamon Preschools, as well as the running of the Ardlethan Preschool, to ensure accessible childcare options are available locally. Council's delivery of Federal and State Government funded services through Allawah Community Care have ensured that aged vulnerable residents are able to stay longer in their own homes and community. This term has seen a significant increase in the services provided through Allawah Community Care from two homecare packages in 2017 to 64 packages in 2021. Provision of aged housing, residential aged care and retirement village accommodation across the shire has also enabled people to remain in the Coolamon Shire and in contact with their communities and loved ones. Various community development activities including Youth Week, "Skill UP!" program and participation in REROC youth forums aim at engaging the youth of the Shire.

Coolamon Shire Council is comprised of six communities, each with their own distinct character. Council continues to protect and enhance these towns and villages by providing the services appropriate to the needs of those communities.

Council has continued to provide and maintain safe and serviceable public facilities and infrastructure. Council prides itself on being consultative and participatory with annual tours of the various Advance Committees to continue to gather issues of importance at a local level. This of course then has to be balanced with the management requirements of Council's entire asset portfolio. Council has also delegated the Advance Committees with the care, control and management of local assets. Council has developed a Hierarchy of roads and supported this with ongoing operational, maintenance and capital replacement programs. Council is always mindful of the ongoing impact new assets can have on Councils ability to maintain existing and future services. We understand the need for improvement, but must maintain what we have already, before we stretch our resources and ability to serve.

Council continues to support the NSW Government to protect the Shire's community from crime, fire, anti-social activities and threats to community safety. Council has been an active member of the Rural Fire Service Riverina Zone and supports the Emergency Services of NSW Fire & Rescue, State Emergency Service and RFS through the payment of annual levies. Council has continued to make representations to the NSW Police and local members to ensure that adequate policing is provided to the Shire. The implementation of Alcohol Free Zones has helped to address social standards together with Council's support of the Coolamon Drug Action Team consultation with the community regarding drug use and abuse.

SO COUNCIL....

Like many rural communities, sport, recreation, the arts and cultural opportunities are essential to the social fabric of our towns and villages. These activities are the lifeblood of our Shire, and contribute to the health and well-being of our residents.

Council has created opportunities for residents to participate in active and healthy recreational activities through the ongoing trusteeship of a number of recreational reserves within the Shire including Redgrave Park, Coolamon Golf Course and Jim Thompson Touch Fields, Coolamon Showground, Ardlethan Showground and the Ganmain Swimming Pool.

This term has seen the completion of basketball courts in Ganmain, Ardlethan, Beckom, Marrar and Matong. As well as being utilised as courts, these spaces host both the mobile skate park and pump track which are shared between towns and villages on a rotating roster. Council's Parks and gardens have seen significant upgrades this term, with the upgrade of play equipment in all towns and villages, as well as BBQ area upgrades in Lions, Redgrave and Ganmain Victory Gardens. Council's establishment of a multi purpose trail in Kindra Forest, as well as the additional Gilgai Track and Urban Track for use of residents and visitors, together with the ongoing implementation of Council's Active Transport Plan for paths continue to encourage cycling and walking across the entire shire.

Council in conjunction with the Riverina Regional Library provides innovative library services across the Shire through the Coolamon Shire Library and the visiting Mobile Library.



Council support and promotion of the arts and cultural development has seen the "Capture Coolamon Shire" photographic competition, NYE Fest and Australia Day Celebrations being held annually. Council has continued to implement "Art Acquisition Prize" with the purchase of an entry at the "Up-2-Date Art Exhibition" and the "Ardlethan Art Show" by a person who resides in the Coolamon Shire. Council has continued to implement the Event Management Strategy and the Annual Event Funding program that support local communities in developing and staging events celebrating arts, artists and cultural development and promote community spirit.


SO COUNCIL...

Council sees climate adaptability as paramount to all that we do as an organisation. We aim to employ strategies to protect the natural environment, our rich heritage and to manage the impact of land use within our communities. Council are acutely aware that the agricultural base of our economy and communities require appropriate managment and protection. This, and the need to ensure our resources are adaptable to climate variability see Council employ strategies to protect the natural environment.

Council has provided community leadership in resource use, reuse and recycling over the past term in a number of ways.

To add to a number of facilities that Council had previously installed solar panels on, installations at the Coolamon Early Childhood Centre, Allawah Lodge, Council admin building, Ardlethan and Beyond Museum and the Coolamon and Ardlethan Pools.

Council also extended the recycled water scheme in Coolamon to service various parks and gardens areas and the recycling of Organics in the townships of Coolamon and Ganmain reflect Council's commitment to resources use, reuse and recycling.

SO COUNCIL...

Coolamon Shire Council appreciates that our natural heritage is part of our identity and needs to be preserved through careful and quality urban planning. As an organisation we aim to provide leadership to the community to ensure that our built and natural heritage is protected and celebrated for generations to come.

Council's activities towards protecting natural landscapes and systems has seen the ongoing membership of the Riverina Easter Noxious Weeds Authority to manage and provide education in the control of weeds on both private and public land. Council also maintains membership to Landcare. The implementation of Council's On-site Sewerage Management Policy has ensured that, based on risk, systems are not harming the environment. Council continues to have in place Voluntary Conservation Agreements to protect native vegetation that has been identified as important.





SO COUNCIL...

Council understands that managing our resources needs to reflect a wider national or global outcome, but also needs to reflect both the needs and capacity of our organisation and our communities. Council continues to be a leader in relation to the reduction of waste to landfill through effective management and recycling. Council has continued with offering recycling collections within the defined scavenging areas and has increased it's recycling activities by the introduction of organic collections for the towns of Coolamon and Ganmain. The construction of a Community Recycling Shed at the Coolamon Waste Depot in conjunction with REROC and the Environmental Protection Agency will ensure that specific hazardous waste that would have normally been deposited in landfill will also be recycled. Coolamon Council also conduct an annual collection of bigger domestic waste items. Council continues to look at opportunities regarding the construction of waste transfer stations as part of a consolidation of Council's waste management activities.





As a result of our decisions and policies for creating well presented and maintained commercial precincts, together with the emphasis on offering affordable lifestyle choices for families, the Coolamon Shire has seen a growth in population, and with it, business opportunities.

Council have continued to promote and support existing and new business investment within the shire over the past five years through the ongoing employment of the Business and Tourism Development Officer. Council continues liaising with both the Federal and State Government agencies in relation to industrial development and promotion. Council continues to develop and implement initiatives to promote the local and regional economy. Council has focused development within the Shire by ensuring that public services and facilities are not unnecessarily duplicated. Consolidation of Council's resources to defined focal points has resulted in the works undertaken at Ardlethan in relation to the Short Stay Caravan Area and the expansion to the Coolamon Caravan Park. Council has continued with the development of residential land in Coolamon and has other land banks available for future development



We are ever mindful of the opportunities that exist due to our location and characteristics that provide great opportunities for day visitation. Whilst the last term has been challenging, drought, fire and a pandemic, we have still managed to retain partnerships to to promote what we have. Council's activities in focusing on the unique identity of the Shire include continuing membership of the Visit Riverina, Country Change and Wagga Tourism Partnership programs. Council continues to maintain a dedicated Tourism and Business Website and offers funding to successful applicants to fund promotion of local events through the Events Funding Program. The development of the Canola Trail is a strategic joint venture between Coolamon, Temora and Junee Shires. This term has also seen the completion of the new Coolamon Shire Visitors Guide and Visit Coolamon Shire website.

SO COUNCIL...

Council understands that the productivity of our region is based on our rural economy.

Council has readily supported the retention of the farming population and the maintenance and enhancement of farming productivity.

Applications under the NSW State Government's Fixing Country Road Program has resulted in the allocation of \$1,844,300 towards total project costs of \$2,838,249 to be spent on Council's road network to support agricultural product receivable points and freight pinch points. Council also supported the Rural Financial Counselling Service and the Riverina Joint Organisation's Drought Committee during the past term. Our participation in REROC and the development of the Regional Freight Transport Plan have provided a strategic approach to the movement of freight and Councils response to maintenance of capital work to support this. It has also lead to the advocacy and support to implement improvements to some of the identified pinch points.

Council also participated in the farm gate access trial that aims to support the improved movement of agricultural produce and remove the last mile issues.

SO COUNCIL..

Our most important resource is our people and we aim to facilitate and encourage all members of our community to participate and be heard. Whilst we understand tat consensus cannot be achieved on all issues, everyone's voice adds to the discussion process.

Council has encouraged community leadership with the support provided to the various Section 355 Committee's, close ties and sponsorship with the local schools. Council's Annual "Morning Tea with the Mayor" brings together school leaders from across the Shire with Councillors and Staff to learn more about Local Government and opens the lines of communication for those younger people to voice their views.

Council now broadcast the monthly Council meeting online, allowing members of the community to listen to meeting proceedings.

SO COUNCIL...

Encourages two-way communication with the community regarding Council's activities, including the ongoing establishment of Advance Committees, annual tour with community members, regular social media posts and interactions and the production of Council's monthly newsletter. Staff and Councillors have been present at a number of Advance Committee meetings to hear first-hand the issues that locals have regarding their community. Council sees these actions as necessary to see that the Shire's community is partnered in planning the future of the shire.

Council sees participation in regional relationships and strategic networks as not only beneficial but necessary for the Coolamon Shire. Membership of REROC, Riverina Joint Organisation, Eastern Riverina Arts, Riverina Eastern Noxious Weeds Authority, NSW Rural Fire Service – Riverina Zone, Riverina Regional Tourism and Riverina Regional Library as a way of ensuring that the services and facilities that Council provides are both cost effective and what our residents deserve in today's day and age.

Council understands that local governance is critical to protect our communities and resources. This is best maintained by ensuring we remain financially viable and sustainable.

Council continues to demonstrate a strong financial position and has implemented a Risk Management System across Council's operations to minimise risk for Council and the community. Ongoing review of Council's progress including Community Satisfaction Surveys and Delivery Plan reports ensure priority areas continue to be acted upon.

Council's ongoing relationships with State and Federal Members and various Government Departments ensure that the interests of the Coolamon Shire are strongly advocated. Examples of this include the Coolamon and Ardlethan Ambulance Stations, additional funding opportunities for the construction of the Ardlethan Sewerage Scheme and funding for the amenities upgrades at the Ganmain and Ardlethan Pools.

COUNCIL COMMUNICATION

The large majority of residents (82%) receive their information about Council activities through the Council monthly newsletters.

Many residents now also engage with Council online via Facebook (31%) and website (29%)

COUNCIL CONSULTATION

Most residents (57%) were satisfied with Council's consultation with the local community.

The most common forms of consultation undertaken by Coolamon residents were contacting Council directly (65%) and speaking to Councillors (42%)






